How did you meet? We met at the Lake Henry Legion at their bowery dance on July 14, 1974. Harvey claims he picked me as his sweetheart when he voted for me as queen at the Valentine's Day carnival in elementary school when I was crowned queen in second grade. I have to believe him because Harvey doesn't forget anything.

Who proposed and how? We had talked about marriage and had picked our rings out together, but I wasn't sure when I was actually receiving my engagement ring. Harvey proposed to me when he brought me home after a night out on March 29, 1975, in his car. Even though I knew we would be getting married, the reality of the commitment was shocking to me at the age of 18. Obviously, I made the right choice at a young age; we celebrated our 33rd anniversary last October.

How long were you engaged? Our engagement was six months long. That time frame was not unusual in those days. I had two friends in high school who also got married that year. Without planning this, we were all married within three weeks of each other. We had to be back from our honeymoons for each other's weddings. And all three couples are still together.

How large was your wedding? 275 people.

What food was served? We had the traditional meal of chicken, ham, dressing, mashed potatoes, gravy, corn, and coleslaw at Jerry's Supper Club in Richmond. We paid \$2 per plate and \$2.25 per plate for the bride's table. We served 273 people.

What was most memorable about your wedding? Diane's uncle played the concertina for an extra half hour after the reception ended so we could have a sing-along for tradition's sake. My family sings songs when we have family gatherings with the aunts and uncles.

The song, Schnitzelbank, is always sung in German. We also both remember our car not starting when we were ready to leave on our honeymoon because somebody had tampered with it.
